Some Observations on Multilateral Support

-Activities are Mandate-Based

- STIP Reviews
 - Nairobi Makifiano (para. 38(v))
 - ECOSOC resolution E/2017/22
 - GA resolution A/Res/72/228

-Technical Assistance is Demand Driven

- Reasons for TA requests vary
 - Not strictly because lack of local capacity
 - Not strictly 'foundational'
 - Value added not only from expertise, also universality
